Convoitise Winter Spelt

- High untreated yields
- High specific weight
- Bread making quality
- Variety adapted to organic and low input farming
- Increasingly used in livestock rations

Spelt is an ancient grain which has been around for 7,000 years and harvested for food for over 2,500 years. Its profile has changed very little over this time.

The crop is enjoying a revival in popularity in artisan breads and cereals and is increasingly employed as a component in livestock rations.
