This document has been created to help our Nelson growers achieve the best from their crop, whilst considering increasing costs of production.

Based on recent studies performed by NIAB, Nelson has a **significant** cost saving element in its armoury of traits. With rates down as low as 175kg/ha of N, it has been proven to achieve the 14% Protein, whilst still yielding on average 8.1t/ha. *NIAB trial figures 2021-2022

The table of results comes from a comprehensive study conducted by Dr Shah of NIAB. It shows the difference between application rate and final protein content of Nelson. It also shows the difference between a year where moisture availability

was good (2021) and a year where it was extremely dry (2022).

Defra's NVZ rules

Nmax is a legal maximum limit averaged over the area of the crop on the farm. Nmax for winter wheat is 220 kg/ha of nitrogen, subject to the following adjustments:

- + 40 kg/ha for milling wheat varieties
- + 20 kg/ha for each t/ha over the standard yield (8 t/ha)
- + 20 kg/ha for shallow soils, excluding shallow soils over sandstone

Berkshire arable farmer, Nick Philp, grows 80 hectares of Nelson E-class winter wheat, on contract to Heygates.

"We're in the Thames Valley, which means it gets very hot and we are prone to drought. We're not in record-breaking wheat yielding country, but Nelson performs well, holding its Hagberg with good grain quality", says Nick.

"Our fungicide bill on Nelson is cut by 30% and the premium and reduced growing cost more than makes up for the lesser yield", he says.

"We applied 250kg of nitrogen last year and reached 14 – 15% protein.

This nitrogen application rate is on par with other conventional varieties on the farm, but they struggled to achieve 13% protein, so it is highly efficient, and this year we can get away with cutting back a bit to achieve the Heygates specification."

"Nelson also has a fantastic disease profile, it's very clean, and is a tall wheat which doesn't lodge", adds Nick.

"We have found Nelson a great variety to achieve milling premiums on a lower input system. On our Cotswold brash soils, it has produced a better yield and specific weight, and over 1% higher protein, than other group one varieties on the same inputs."
